

Mean Mom — Bill of Rights

I. Freedom of Speech/Religion.

You've the right to freely share parenting wisdom and exercise religious beliefs in your home.

II. Right to Bear Arms.

You've the right to discipline— but not abuse.

III. Right not to House the Enemy.

You've the right to decide what/who comes in or goes out of your home.

IV. Right to Search and Seizure.

You've the right to search your child's room at any-time of the day or night and have the right to seize spiritual contraband.

V. Right Against Self-Incrimination.

You've the right to tell your children as little about your past as you decide to.

VI. Right to Counsel.

You've the right to consult with your pastor or counselor.

VII. Right to a Jury.

You've the right to request prayer and have your concerns heard by a jury of your peers—other parents who've encountered similar parenting situations.

VIII. Right to NOT be Subject to Cruel and Unusual Punishment.

You've the right to not be held hostage by pouting or a bad attitude, because you have the right to be treated kindly, courteously and with respect.

X. Rights are Governed by God.

The rights enumerated here are never to be in conflict with God's Word, which reigns supreme.
